Purpose

The University of Michigan's Program in Law, Economics, and Technology is offering a post-graduate Fellowship in Law, Economics, and Technology. The Fellowship supports research by an individual who has finished graduate school (or is about to finish) and is writing on topics in the intersection between law, economics, and technology. The purpose of the fellowship is to foster research and interest in areas of Intellectual Property and Innovation, with emphasis on economics and empiricism as the disciplines of inquiry. The Fellow is expected to devote their time to their proposed course of research, to be in residence at the Law School in Ann Arbor, and to participate in the Law School's law-and-economics activities. Fellowship is either for one or two semesters.

Eligibility

Fellow should have completed graduate studies (such as J.D., Ph.D, or a Masters degree). Applications will also be accepted from students who are in the advanced stage of completing doctoral studies in fields related to Innovation. The Fellowship is intended for a graduate who has demonstrated an interest in questions of law and economic policy and expertise in the areas of information and technology, and who is likely to make significant contributions to teaching and scholarship in this area.

Awards

The Fellowship in Law, Economics, and Technology provides a stipend of up to \$25,000 per semester (\$50,000 per year), depending on the seniority and experience of the fellow. Fellow will also be provided with office space, access to a computer and printer, and an allowance for research and office supplies.

Application Procedure

To apply for the 2010-11 Fellowship in Law, Economics, and Technology, please submit the following by February 28, 2010:

1. A Fellowship Application cover sheet (downloadable from URL below);
2. Statement describing your interest in law, economics, and technology (up to 1,000 words);
3. A scholarly paper you have written;
4. Curriculum Vitae;
5. Undergraduate and graduate transcripts;
6. Two sealed letters of recommendation.
