## **Purpose**

The University of Michigan Law School's Center for Law and Economics is offering several post-graduate Fellowships in Law, Economics, and Technology. The Fellowships support research by individuals who finished graduate school (or are about to finish) and are writing on topics in the intersection between law, economics, and technology. Individuals who practiced in these areas and are interested in returning to academia are also encouraged to apply. The purpose of the fellowships is to foster research and interest in areas of Intellectual Property, Telecommunications, Internet and Cyberlaw, Health Care Law and Policy, and other areas related to information and technology, with emphasis on economics and empiricism as the disciplines of inquiry. The Fellows are expected to devote their time to their proposed course of research, to be in residence at the Law School in Ann Arbor, and to participate in the Law School's law-and-economics activities. Fellowships are either for one or two semesters.

## **Eligibility**

Fellows should have completed graduate studies (such as J.D., Ph.D, or a Masters degree). Applications will also be accepted from students who are in their advanced stage of study toward a graduate degree, with the understanding that their graduation will precede the Fellowship term. The Fellowships are intended for graduates who have demonstrated an interest in questions of law and economic policy and expertise in the areas of information and technology, and who are likely to make significant contributions to teaching and scholarship in this area.

## **Awards**

The Fellowships in Law, Economics, and Technology provide a stipend of up to \$25,000 per semester (\$50,000 per year), depending on the seniority and experience of the fellow. Fellows will also be provided with office space, access to a computer and printer, and an allowance for research and office supplies.

## **Application Procedure**

To apply for the Fellowship in Law, Economics, and Technology, please submit the following:

1. A Fellowship Application cover sheet;
2. Statement describing your interest in law, economics, and technology (up to 1,000 words);
3. A scholarly paper you have written;
4. Curriculum Vitae;
5. Undergraduate and graduate transcripts;
6. Two letters of recommendation to be **sent directly** to the Center.
