An Arab-American civil rights organization. Interns must be currently enrolled in college and have completed at least one year of undergraduate study. This includes recent graduates, graduate students and law students. Individual departments have their own requirements. Interns are expected to become a regular ADC members. During the summer, up to 15 internships are available at the national office. The internships are full time positions and normally last from June 1 to July 31. There is a \$1000 for graduate students. Those who receive course credit for the internship do not receive a stipend.

The student or the sponsoring university will be responsible for round-trip travel costs to Africa, medical insurance (including Medevac insurance), automobile and other insurance, and all other costs not paid or reimbursed by USAID. If internship is located in DC, the internship is unpaid.
