



Mary Goodman is an Advisor in the Strategy, Policy and Review Department at the International Monetary Fund, where she focuses on financial sector issues and represents the Fund in the G-20 Infrastructure and Investment Working Group. She has public sector and market experience. From 2009-2010 she was Special Assistant to President Obama for financial markets at the National Economic Council under Director Lawrence Summers, and she served on the transition team developing the US Financial Stability Plan during the Global Financial Crisis. She had earlier been an economist at the US Treasury Department for eight years during the 1990s. Prior to joining the IMF, she was Managing Director at JAE Credit Management LP, a global liquid credit fund (previously James Caird Asset Management).
