## Maytal Gilboa

Maytal Gilboa is a postdoctoral fellow at the Federmann Center for the Study of Rationality, The Hebrew University of Jerusalem. She recently submitted her PhD dissertation titled "Causation and Unjust Enrichment: Factual Causation in Restitution Following Profitable Appropriation of Right" under the supervision of professor Ariel Porat, at Tel Aviv University, Faculty of Law. Her dissertation offers theoretical and doctrinal frameworks for the implementation of the but-for test in unjust enrichment claims of taking. It offers original explanations of current doctrines and suggests tools that enable courts to determine whether a causal link exists between a specific taking event and each dollar the defendant successively obtained. In addition, the dissertation suggests how courts should contend with taking cases in which, due to factual uncertainty, the but-for test is unable to provide a definitive conclusion on the existence of causality.

Maytal holds a BA in management, an LLB and an LLM, all from Tel Aviv University. Prior to her doctoral studies in Tel Aviv University, she practiced law for five years; the last two as a legal consultant for one of Israel's leading industrial enterprises.
