Sophia is research associate and PhD student at the Universität der Bundeswehr Munich, Germany. Her dissertation titled “the humanitarian protection of the environment in non-international armed conflicts” deals with the protection of the environment through progressive interpretation of international humanitarian law taking into account humanitarian and environmental ethics and their influence on positive law.

Sophia studied law at the Ludwig-Maximilians-Universität Munich, focusing on public international and European law. During her studies she worked as research assistant at the Institute for Public International Law at the Ludwig-Maximilians-Universität chaired by Prof. Dr. Georg Nolte, member of the International Law Commission. After obtaining her First State Exam in the Free State of Bavaria, Sophia pursued her LL.M. at the University of Michigan Law School in 2010/2011.

Sophia worked as research associate at the Institute for Public International Law at the Ludwig-Maximilians Universität Munich and coordinator of the Munich Advanced Course in International Law (MACIL) summer school. At the same time, she held the position of a lecturer for public law, constitutional law and administrative law at the Universität der Bundeswehr München. She also held a lectureship on international humanitarian law.

Since 2013 Sophia is working as research associate at the chair of Professor Dr. Daniel-Erasmus Khan concentrating on international humanitarian law and European law. In this capacity, she teaches various courses to members of the German military and publishes on European law and international humanitarian law. She will stay at the Université Laval, Quebec for a research fellowship during summer 2015.
