Anne Dienelt is a doctoral candidate at the University of Goettingen in Germany under the supervision of Professor Andreas L. Paulus, Judge at the German Constitutional Court. Anne's research interests include various fields of public international law, in particular international humanitarian law, international human rights law and international environmental law. Her thesis concerns the protection of the environment in times of armed conflict, focusing on the interplay of the different legal regimes providing for a protection of the environment.

Anne studied law at the Universities of Tuebingen and Goettingen, Germany, and Aix-en-Provence, France, where she received the *maîtrise en droit*. Since 2012, she has been working at the Institute for International Affaires at the University of Hamburg as a research and teaching fellow with Professor Stefan Oeter. In this capacity, she gives lectures in public international law and in German administrative and public law. Anne has assisted the UN International Law Commission during its sessions in Geneva on a regular basis in the past years. She has inter alia published in the Max Planck Encyclopedia of Public International Law and with OUP's "International Law in Domestic Courts"-project.
