Sonya Ziaja is an assistant professor at the University of Baltimore School of Law, where she teaches Environmental Law; Climate Adaptation, Law and Equity; and Property. Ziaja's research interests focus on the overlapping areas of environmental governance and law, technology and society.

Her approach to these questions draws on her interdisciplinary background in geography, water policy, and her practical experience in energy and climate adaptation regulation for the state of California. She was a lead author of California's Fourth Climate Assessment. And, her research has informed the climate adaptation strategy of the U.S. National Parks Service and the first climate adaptation regulation of investor-owned energy utilities in California. Before coming to UB Law, she worked in energy regulation at the California Public Utilities Commission and was the research lead for the Water, Energy, Climate Nexus at the California Energy Commission.

Ziaja holds a Ph.D. in Geography from the University of Arizona, M.Sc. in Water Science, Policy and Management from the University of Oxford, and J.D. from the University of California, Hastings College of the Law.
