



### 2018 EXONERATIONS BY CRIME

## YEARS LOST TO WRONGFUL IMPRISONMENT

Last year The Registry marked a milestone: The number of years that exonerated defendants lost in prison for crimes they did not commit exceeded **20,000 years** in September 2018.

# **SERGEANT WATTS SCANDAL**

#### **CHICAGO MISCONDUCT**

**Thirty-one** defendants who had been framed by police on drug and weapons charges were exonerated in the wake of a scandal involving corrupt Chicago police officers led by Sergeant Ronald Watts in 2018.


# **86\* EXONERATIONS**

Innocence organizations (IOs) were involved in a record **86** exonerations in 2018.

# **1,639\* YEARS**

Defendants exonerated in 2018 spent an average of **10.9 years** incarcerated for their convictions, for a total of 1,639 total years lost.



# **44 NATIONWIDE**

There were 44 Conviction Integrity Units (CIUs) in the United States in 2018, more than three times the number in 2013. CIUs were involved in **58** exonerations in 2018.
