CLOTHING ISSUE**

Upon arriving at the institution, the clothing issue department will provide offenders, going to General Population or Administrative Segregation, in Housing Unit 2, with the following state issue items - Two (2) sheets and one (1) pillowcase will be provided by the housing unit.

The following clothing for Housing Unit 1 Offenders will be put in their footlocker with their personal property.

T-SHIRTS	(2)

SOCKS	(2 pr.)
DUCK COAT	(1)

During the R & O period, clothing issue staff and property room staff will determine the types and amounts of property the offender currently has in their personal property. Once housing needs have been determined and the offender is being released to general population, the following required state property items will be issued:

GRAY PANTS	(3)
GRAY SHIRT	(3)
FOOTWEAR	(1 pr.) - Unless offender has medical issued footgear.

Additionally, the following state property may be issued to the offender providing they wish to accept, while keeping within the authorized total amounts:

## **WARNING SIGNS AND SYMPTOMS OF SUICIDE**

Ways to identify a potential suicide situation include knowing the signs and symptoms exhibited by a person who is "being pushed" or has reached the "breaking point". When they are suicidal, most offenders exhibit these red flags. Rarely does a suicide occur without the appearance of several signs and symptoms. Often, however, only one or two signs or symptoms can alert a trained, positive-minded individual to a potentially suicidal offender. Suicidal offenders exhibit a variety of traits and behaviors, or signs and symptoms.

### Warning Signs of Offender Suicide:

- Experience a loss of someone (spouse, close friend, parent, sibling, etc.) or something (appeal, release date, custody level).
- Persistent sad mood.
- Sudden changes in eating habits producing weight loss; person is not dieting.
- Sudden loss of interest in daily activities or personal interests.
- Isolates self, withdraws from normal level of interpersonal interactions.
- Discusses feelings of personal guilt, shame or failure.
- Discusses thoughts of ending one's life or reports attempted suicide in the past.
- Suddenly gives away prized personal possessions.
- Obtains the means to harm self (saves medication).

Notify staff immediately if you observe this type of behavior or warning signs in another offender.
