Dear Mr. Cavataro:

This letter is in response to your February 14, 2014 email to JoEllen Smith, Chief of Office of Communications, in which you make a request for public records. I have reviewed your request and my response follows. A copy of your request is attached for reference.

1. Any current prisoner handbook or manual, whether system-wide or institution-specific.

Please find attached inmate pamphlet on the inmate grievance procedure. Please note the pamphlet is tri-fold, but all sides should be copied.

2. All current prisoner grievance regulations, policies, guidelines, manuals, directives, rules, etc., including general grievance policies/guidelines/etc. and specific grievance policies/guidelines/etc. relating to, for example, healthcare or sexual assault.

The attached document, 5120-9-31, is the sole rule governing the inmate grievance procedure. Other ODRC policies may cover specific grievance guidelines, for example, policy 79-ISA-02. - 3. Any records, created or updated from 2003 to the present, tallying or reporting:
  - a. The number of grievances filed and resolved each year.
  - b. The categories or subject matter of grievances filed and resolved, and number of grievances in each subject matter category used.
  - c. Grievance outcomes or resolutions each year, by subject matter category and year.
  - d. Statistics or data on length of time to resolve grievances, by subject matter category and year.
