Keren is a student in the direct Ph.D. program of Law at Zvi Meitar Center for Advanced Legal Studies. Her dissertation titled "Incorporation of Decision Support Systems in Judicial Decision-Making" is being conducted under the supervision of Prof. Eyal Benvenisti and Prof. Uri Schild. The thesis discusses the feasibility of integration of computerized decision support systems in the judiciary, the effects it will have on adjudication and on the legal system, and suggest guidelines for the design, development and incorporations of such systes.
