Federal Court Cases: Civil Terminations and Pending Database 1970-2012

Codebook

Introduction

The Administrative Office of the U.S. Courts (AO) annually releases, via the Inter-university Consortium for Political and Social Research, <u>www.icpsr.com</u>, a dataset describing each federal case terminated, and those cases that remain pending, along with codebooks. There has been some shifting over time in how the variables are coded, what those variables are titled, the normalized values, etc. The largest substantive changes occurred in 1979 and 1987, when many of the variables shifted enough that they are not easily analyzed across the time periods. More recently, the variables and their values have not changed much, but variable names have. (They used to have numbers, rather than names.) In this codebook, in order to facilitate adding in new data as it is released, I have used the variable names as they appear most recently.

In addition to annual codebooks, in which it is possible to trace these changes over time, the AO issued a 1985 Guide to Judicial Policies and Procedures, available <u>here</u>¹, and a similar document in 1999, the "Civil Statistical Reporting Guide," available <u>here</u>². As of the date of this document, the most recent codebook is posted by ICPSR for the 2012 terminations data, <u>here</u>³.

For a number of projects, I have combined the annual terminations data into one large file, and then added the most recent pending data, as well. The large resulting file thus includes a record of every civil case filed in federal district courts since 1970. The combination has required some manipulation to line up the variables as they've changed names and permitted values. For details on that manipulation for 1970-2001 data, see the <u>Technical Appendix</u>⁴ to Margo Schlanger, Inmate Litigation, 116 Harv. L. Rev. 1555 (2003). For details on the most recent aggregation, which added in 2002-2012 terminations data, see the <u>Data Appendix</u>⁵ to Margo Schlanger, Trends in Prisoner Litigation, as the PLRA Enters Adulthood," 5 U.C. IRVINE L. REV. (2015).

The ICPSR, at the instruction of the Bureau of Justice Statistics, which manages the archiving process for the AO, has barred users from reposting the data. Instead, it must be obtained from ICPSR by each researcher. Accordingly, I cannot post the data themselves. In the interest of transparency and replicability (and to help researchers avoid repeating work I have already done), I post instead, this codebook. It does three things:

1) It sets out the variable names and descriptions for the AO data, aggregating the many codebooks and details for the many datasets from 1970-2012.

- 2) It sets out and explains the origins of additional variables I have created from that raw data, to use for various purposes—sometimes to normalize across versions of variable, other times to transform the data into something more useful for my purposes.
- 3) It includes raw frequencies for each variable.

AO variables are in bold; non-AO variables are also bold, but in *red and italicized*. All variables are presented in alphabetical order by variable name. The parenthetical note that follows the AO variables comes from the AO codebooks; it is a brief variable description.

Composition of dataset

These data are archived by the ICPSR, which assigns to them a study number (**study**, in my dataset). Every update to each is reflected in a study date (**study_date**, in my dataset). They are released annually; each release more or less for a given termination year. The releases are grouped by **tapeyear**.

The relevant studies are in the following table. I've also included the current most-recent study dates. Note, however, that the data I have used are almost invariably *not* the versions indicated by the study dates. (I include the study date variable so that I have a place to keep that date in the future if I redo the aggregation work.)

A note on my own use of these data. The study date for study no. 8429 is the most recent updated version, but I used an earlier version (and neglected to record its update date). In addition, when I looked at these ICPSR data for 2009-2012 and pending, there were very significant omissions from the datasets. I obtained corrected data from the Administrative Office directly. It is my understanding that those corrections were being made with ICPSR as well, but I have not gone back and re-obtained data from ICPSR, preferring to stick with the versions from the AO. The study dates for those tapeyears suggest that perhaps the corrections were not made: I advise anyone using those data to check carefully to ensure that they are complete.

Note on variables and frequencies. There are several variables for which the data somehow went missing, over the years I assembled the aggregated file. They are listed in this codebook, but I currently have only partial data for them, as marked. To correct these omissions, I would need to go back to the original data and reassemble; this would be a good deal of work, and I have not needed these particular variables, so I haven't done that.

They are:

arbit: Collected 1997 to present. I have only 2005-present in the aggregated files (apparently only partial data in 2008).

def: Collected every year, but masked by ICPSR. I have 1970-2000, but in individual files, not in the aggregated dataset. In the aggregated dataset, I have only 2009-.

ifp: 2001 to present. But I have only 2006- in the aggregated dataset.

plt: Same as def

residenc: 1970 to present. But I have only 2005-present in the aggregated dataset.

transoff: 1997 to present. But I have only 2005-present in the aggregated dataset.

transorg: Same as transoff.

trmarb: Same as transoff.

amtrec

(Monetary Judgment Amount Awarded) Dollar amount received, in thousands. Coded 9999 for amounts greater than \$9,999,000.

Total cases with values: 759,341

arbit

(arbitration at filing) Collected 1997 to present. I have only 2005-present in the aggregated files (apparently only partial data in 2008). This variable is used only by the courts participating in the Formal Arbitration Program. There are approximately 20. It is not used for any other purpose. It indicates the type of arbitration participation.

If a land condemnation case, the code is associated with the tract of land. If the location is within the U.S. but, outside the home state, the code is 88888. If the location is outside the U.S. the code is 99999. NOTE: For full County Codes refer to ICPSR Codebooks (e.g., the 2012 codebook)

demanded

(Monetary Amount Demanded). Numeric, capped at four digits. The monetary amount sought by plaintiff (in thousands). Money amounts less than \$500 appear as 1. Dollar figure is rounded to the nearest thousand. (eg, \$1,234.56 would appear as a single digit (1). Courts have not always reported this field in thousands of dollars, therefore data may not be accurate.

disp05

(Disposition of Case, 2005-). The manner in which the case was disposed of by the district court. This variable is titled, simply, **disp**, in the raw AO data of the relevant tapeyears. As described under **disp87**, there was a minor change in variable labels in 2005. I merged disp for 2005 to 2012 into disp87. But to also preserve the original data, I kept, as well, a variable **disp05**

distnum

District Number. Recoding of the AO's "**district**" variable: non-numeric values changed to numeric, and multiplied by 10, to preserve them as integers.

djoined

(date issue joined) I have this only for the datasets I received from the AO, 2009-2012. It is a string variable, format %rdD_m_Y. The 2012 codebook notes "Data rarely entered in the past. This field is no longer being used." That seems to be incorrect, but it does seem to hold very unreliable data, based on comparing it with **procprog87**.

docket

(docket) The number assigned by the clerks' office; consists of 2-digit docket year (usually calendar year in which the case was filed) and 5-digit sequence number.

docketyr

Docket year stored numerically, and in a 4-digit format.

filedate

(Filing Date) Date the case was filed in the district court (in a string format, the details of which have varied over the tapeyears). Corrections have been made from original data to eliminate obviously incorrect data. In my dataset, this is made consistent and filled in for all tapeyears.

filedy

Day of the month the case was filed, pulled from filedate. Corrections made from original data, to deal with impossible values.
